

In-Lab Test COVID19 Safety Protocols

- Staff will wear personal protective equipment (PPE) to keep patients and staff safe.
- PPE will include masks, eyewear, gowns and gloves.
- Patient will arrive at the center wearing a mask and gloves.
- Hand sanitizer will be available at the entrance and other locations in the center.
- Patients will be instructed to arrive alone; they cannot bring other family members to their appointment without prior approval.
- Patients will fill out the COVID19 screening form, which includes taking the patient's temperature. If temperature is greater than 100.4 F and/or any answers to questions raise concerns for the Center, the patient will be asked to return at a later date.
- Any other concerns for staff at that point will be directed to the On-Call Sleep Physician.
- If screening process is negative, patient will be escorted to their room to begin the procedure.

In-Lab Testing Protocol

- Facility and sensors are disinfected using Hospital Grade cleaners and disinfectants.
- Where applicable, disposable sensors and monitors will be used.
- Electrodes and sensors will be applied in a timely fashion to reduce interaction between staff and patient.
- A minimum of 6 hours of recording time is necessary for an accurate test.
- Upon completion of the test, electrodes and other sensors will be removed and disinfected per CDC and Center protocols.
- Linens will be removed.
- Room will be sprayed with Hospital Grade Disinfectant.
- Room will then be cleaned by a third-party Cleaning service that follows OSHA standards.
- Patient will be called with results within 14 days or less.
